## Phoenix Art Museum brings designer Amy Lau to speak at Independent Woman Luncheon

*Acclaimed New York-based designer will headline the popular fundraiser on January 30, 2018*



**PHOENIX (November 28, 2017)** – In January, Phoenix Art Museum will welcome interior designer Amy Lau as the keynote speaker for the eighth-annual Independent Woman Luncheon. Considered one of the Valley’s most beautiful and beloved philanthropic events, the Independent Woman Luncheon has raised nearly \$2,000,000 on behalf of Phoenix Art Museum since its inception. The event celebrates the Valley’s premier design community as they come together in support of Phoenix Art Museum’s commitment to excellence in visual arts and education. This year, the Luncheon continues its tradition of inviting a high-profile designer to attend, welcoming Arizona native Amy Lau to the Museum to speak about her work. The event will take place on Tuesday, January 30, at 10 am in the Museum’s Cummings Great Hall.

This year’s guest speaker is Amy Lau, whose interiors are known for their expressiveness, impeccable attention to detail, and fusion of fine art and design elements. Born and raised in Arizona, Lau studied art history at the University of Arizona and later received a master’s degree in fine and decorative arts from the prestigious Sotheby’s Institute of Art graduate program in New York. Lau often incorporates curated commissions into her designs, working with emerging and established artists to create original art installations, wall coverings, avant-garde lighting fixtures, and more. Combined with a fondness for mixing vintage and contemporary pieces and an emphasis on a balance between all elements of design, Lau’s work transforms the styles and preferences of individual clients into artistically inspired, refined living spaces.

“We’re delighted to bring Amy Lau to Phoenix Art Museum for this year’s Luncheon,” said Matthew Boland, chair of the 2018 IWL Committee and owner of MMB Studio and Main Dish in Scottsdale. “As an Arizona native and a renowned interior designer with an exceptional knowledge of and appreciation for many kinds of art, Lau is uniquely able to comprehend the gravity of the Independent Woman Luncheon’s mission: to support and elevate the arts and education in Phoenix by bringing world-class art to Phoenix Art Museum and making it accessible to the entire community.”

The Independent Woman Luncheon also offers an exclusive opportunity to see one-of-a-kind pieces by the Valley’s premier design firms. Participating designers have been asked to create Lau-inspired centerpieces, which luncheon guests will be able to bid on. All proceeds will directly support exhibitions and education at the Museum.
